

Rabbi Jeffrey Saxe

Rabbi Saxe joined our clergy in July 2007 after serving as Assistant Rabbi for two years at Central Synagogue in New York City. He was ordained in 2005 and invested as a cantor in 2003, both by Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion (HUC-JIR) in New York. A Wexner Graduate Fellow, he received awards for his work at HUC-JIR in Talmud, Liturgy, Rabbinics, Hazzanut, and other areas. While a rabbinical and cantorial student, he served congregations in New York, Boston and Ohio.

Rabbi Saxe grew up in the San Francisco Bay Area. After graduating from the University of California at Berkeley with a degree in Political Science, he worked in Washington, D.C. for the US Department of Justice as a Civil Rights Analyst. In his current rabbinic role, he has served on Central Conference of American Rabbis (CCAR) committees and is active in interfaith organizations in Northern Virginia.
