

Rabbi Stephanie Bernstein is a native of Duluth, Minnesota. She has a Bachelor's degree from the University of Michigan, an MA in Guidance and Counseling from Eastern Michigan University, and an MSW from Catholic University. Rabbi Bernstein was a clinical social worker for over twenty years. She is a past president of Temple Sinai in DC, and served on the board of the Mid-Atlantic Council of the Union for Reform Judaism (URJ).

Rabbi Bernstein received her rabbinic ordination from Hebrew Union College-Jewish Institute of Religion in May, 2009. During her time at HUC she served as student rabbi at Northern Virginia Hebrew Congregation. Rabbi Bernstein's rabbinical thesis is entitled: "Holocaust Responsa: Questions and Answers from a Time of Despair."

Rabbi Bernstein is the teacher and coordinator for the URJ's Introduction to Judaism classes in the DC area, and is a chaplain with Jewish Social Services, serving Jewish patients in nursing homes and assisted living facilities. She was the Study Guide writer for *The Torah: A Women's Commentary*. Rabbi Bernstein has taught adult education classes at Northern Virginia Hebrew Congregation, facilitated the Interfaith Couples Workshop at the DCJCC, and was a guest lecturer at the Washington National Cathedral. Rabbi Bernstein was Yom HaShoah guest scholar at Stephen Wise Free Synagogue in New York City and delivered the Celia and Audrey Resnik Memorial Lecture at Congregation Beth El in Bethesda. Rabbi Bernstein serves on the boards of the Jewish Community Relations Council of Greater Washington, Jews United for Justice, and is the board chair of Equality Maryland, Inc.
