

FAQ for 3/21/19

If you have ever walked onto our site from Westmoreland Street in high heels, you know that our driveway is quite steep! Our Temple home is situated on a topographically challenging site – not only are we on a hill, but our property is the destination for the excess water that runs off from Westmoreland Street, from Haycock Elementary, and even from the State forest at the end of our property. To better manage all the water that enters our site, we are installing two new water retention systems during this construction project, the first of which is going under the new parking lot. If you were at the Temple in the past week, you would have noticed a complicated new traffic pattern. This was to enable the work shown in this photo: a new pipe was installed to hook up one of our new water retention systems. Thanks to the hard work of our contractors, this work was finished much more quickly than anticipated, and we are back to a far simpler traffic pattern, one that will be in effect for the rest of the building project. Our TRS staff worked closely with the contractors to keep things moving as smoothly as possible during this time, and we continue to be grateful for how responsive the staff and the contractors have been to unexpected challenges.
