Shabbat Evening Services

Weekly on Fridays at 6:30 PM *

The core of Temple Rodef Shalom is our Shabbat service — at the end of the week, we pause for Shabbat and come together as a community. Together, in times of joy, sorrow and every day, we hope to create a spiritual encounter with self, community and God. Sometimes, we have extra programs to celebrate specific holidays or lift up the voices of different groups within our community.

B'oi Shabbat Services

Monthly on the First Friday, 6:30 PM (no service in Jan) Feb 7, Mar 7

Join us for an intimate and informal service, with an emphasis on music and accessible singing. This is an alternative to the family service and is geared towards adults and teens.

Family Shabbat Services

Monthly on the First Friday, 6:30 PM Feb 7, Mar 7

This service is geared towards kids (6th grade and younger) and the teens and adults who love them. Our Family Shabbat Band and cantors are sometimes joined by Shir Harmony or Shir Joy (our youth choirs), and clergy share a story or interactive game rather than a sermon.





Did you know you can donate up to \$105,000 annually from your IRA directly to Temple Rodef Shalom or other charities? Many members give through a Qualified Charitable Distribution (QCD), which can count towards your Required Minimum Distribution (RMD) and also lower your Adjusted Gross Income (AGI) — especially beneficial if you don't itemize deductions.



QCDs can fund donations, endowment gifts, and membership-related payments that provide only intangible religious benefits. IRA owners can begin making QCDs at age 70½, even though RMDs aren't required until age 73. The annual \$105,000 QCD cap will adjust annually for inflation. To maximize benefits, make your QCD before taking any other RMD.
