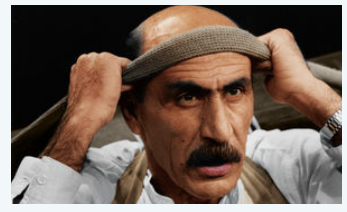
LABORS OF LOVE

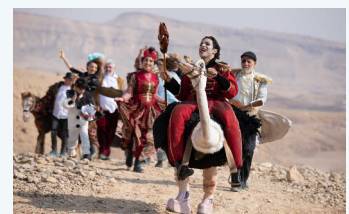
SHORTS - ACTIVISM & COMMUNITIES
